Road resurfacing will begin shortly. As soon as we have our pre-construction meeting with the contractor and get a schedule, we will get it publicized (check the web site). This will only affect Stockwell, Blaney, Rosecrans, and Wilson roads as well as Wildwood Lane.

Recycling

Jenifer Way-Young, Keep Delaware County Beautiful coordinator, is asking for your assistance to keep our recycling bin from overflowing. Take these steps to help maximize our recycling bin's usefulness:

- Break down boxes, and flatten cans and plastic containers.
- Toss materials into the far corners of the bin and make sure voids are filled.
- Never leave materials outside the bin – that's littering.
