LATEX PAINT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AT DKMM HHW EVENTS

To Dispose of Latex Paint:

- Air dry *latex* paint away from children and pets.
- Pour *latex* paint into a plastic lined cardboard box or add absorbent material, such as shredded newspaper or kitty litter. Some home improvement stores may sell an inexpensive latex paint hardener (*check with your local store*). Allow to dry completely.
- Throw the dried paint away with your trash and recycle the empty paint can.
- Air drying is not recommended of oil-based paint. However if the paint has solidified in a closed can, dispose of it in your regular trash.

Recycling Preparation

Rinse

Food debris causes odors and bacteria. Contamination may cause materials to be rejected and landfilled.



Flatten

Save yourself and the recycling bins (or center) space by flattening cans and plastic. Please do not break container glass.

Remove Lids

Metal lids can be recycled, but plastic lids can't! Plastic lids can cause an entire batch of material to be rejected.

Separate

The Delaware County recycling drop off bins are divided into two sections. One section is for aluminum, steel, plastic #1 & #2 and glass food and beverage containers. The other is for boxes and papers. **Please use the correct section to avoid contamination.** Check with your curbside or recycling center operator to find out how they would like items to be separated.



Reuse

Store and transport recyclables in reuseable containers. Recyclers may not accept material in plastic bags. **Do not put plastic bags in the drop off bins.**

Reduce

If you can't recycle a package – look for an alternative product packaged in a recyclable container!

Special Wastes

Appliances can be taken to Sims Recycling. There is a \$15 fee for freon appliances and a \$10 fee for non freon appliances. The Delaware County Solid Waste Transfer Station accepts non freon appliances at no charge. Freon must be removed by a certified technician. Call *Keep Delaware County Beautiful* to ask about our spring drop off event!

Automobiles may be accepted by charities such as the Kidney Foundation, Goodwill & Salvation Army.

Batteries should be traded in at the retailer or taken to the Transfer Station or Sims Recycling. Rechargeables can be taken to Batteries Plus (614) 396-5490.

Cell Phones may be taken to the Columbus Zoo (also accepts cell phone peripherals), Sims Recycling, Delaware County Victims Services or Sheriff's Office.

Electronics are accepted at Sims Recycling. There is a small charge for computer monitors and televisions. See listing in table.

Furniture See Charitable & Resale Stores on reverse.

Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off is held in two of the District's four counties each year in the early fall. Latex paint is not accepted. To learn how to dry latex paint or find out about drop offs, call *Keep Delaware County Beautiful* at (740) 368-1700.

Motor Oil can be taken to TSC or Auto Zone in Delaware, Wal-Mart Tire & Lube in Delaware or Lewis Center or ask your service station.

Tires should be traded in when new tires are purchased. Tires may be taken to the Delaware County Solid Waste Transfer Station (740-369-7700) or Liberty Tire Service of Ohio at 3041 Jackson Pike, Grove City (614-871-8097). Both facilities charge fees. The DKMM Solid Waste District accepts tires at its Household Hazardous Waste drop offs each fall.

Vegetable Oils can be recycled. For more information, call MB Katter at (740) 362-3000.

Yard Waste can be taken to Price-Farms Organics, (740-362-4838) at 4838 Warrensburg Rd. January-March, Call for Hours. April – December, Mon. to Sat. 7:30 AM– 5:30 PM. Residents of the DKMM Solid Waste District may bring yard trimmings at no charge.

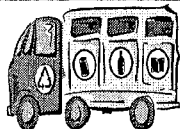

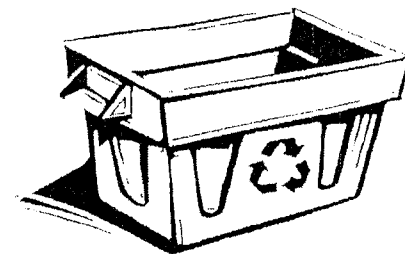
