

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees meeting held 10/16/07

All the officers were present for the regular meeting which convened at 8 P.M. There were eight guests. The minutes of the October 2 meeting were approved as read.

Zoning inspector Donahue spoke on code updates with the BIA. He handed out permit rules for home occupations.

Dumpster day was discussed for November 3.

Paul Eglin will be winterizing the parks.

A Community Policing Officer was present to hand out a written report. He stated the home burglaries are down but vehicles are being broken into with the contents and/ or the vehicle stolen. He stressed that neighbors be alert as to anything out of the ordinary and call the department.

Duane Johnson requested and got permission for the Park Board to install a light at the back of the pavilion.

The water pump at the well in the cemetery is in need of repair. Albrecht will tend to it. Younglas made the motion, second by Conrad the bills be paid as presented. Roll call, all yes.

Two requests have been made for the free use of the hall. The Lorain County Horse Council was granted permission to use it for \$100.00 and the Fire Department can use it for their annual dinner free. Penfield is part of the Fire District.

Conrad checked on the best way to water the new cemetery trees and was told they will soon be dormant and to not do anything until spring.

Top soil is needed at the cemetery gazebo, Younglas will furnish the dirt, Conrad will load it and Gordon haul it in his own truck. Younglas reported that four foundations have been repaired in the cemetery.

Gordon said the Sooy Road project is completed and work on the garage has progressed.

The Solid Waste Grant application was approved on a motion by Gordon, second by Conrad. Motion passed. Eleanor Ghandt was named the Public Records designee. Motion by Conrad, second by Younglas, Roll call, all yes.

The tax rates as set forth by the County were approved on a motion by Gordon, second by Younglas. Roll call, all yes.

With no further business, Younglas made the motion to adjourn at 8:40 P.M.
