

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting

November 3, 2008

Prior to the regular meeting, a public hearing on the rezoning of 40871 Rte. 18 from residential to commercial was held. The Planning Commission and the Zoning Commission had previously approved the change. There was no opposition at the Zoning Commission meeting and none at the trustees meeting. Younglas made the motion, second by Gordon the change be approved. Roll call, all yes.

All the officers were present for the regular meeting of the Penfield Township Trustees. The minutes of the previous meeting were read with one correction. The new light pole will be placed at the hall not the park.

Three resolutions were approved. An application for a grant from the Solid Waste was approved on a motion by Conrad, second by Younglas. Roll call, all yes. A resolution to approve Thomas Younglas as representative to the Rural Lorain County Water Authority for a four year term was approved on a motion by Conrad, second by Gordon. Younglas abstained from voting. The third resolution was approving a contract with Abco for hall fire inspection was approved on a motion by Gordon, second by Conrad. Roll call, all yes.

Gordon made the motion, second by Younglas the bills be paid as presented. Motion carried.

Gordon reported that he has ordered a light fixture for the new pole to match the ones on the buildings and it will be delivered in three weeks. There has been no word on the truck bed. He thanked the Penfield Community Church for serving the gratis meals during the election. A thank you note will be sent. He stated the mulching plates for the mower that were discussed at the last meeting do not fit the township mower. The road sides will be mowed again before bad weather. He reminded that the reflective house number signs are available and people are urged to get them to aid the fire and ambulance if needed.

Conrad stated that the cemetery has had an application of weed and feed. He took a load of plastic to Allied and the price has gone down. A bleak future is expected for it.

Jean Eglin reported that the food distribution at Well Help has greatly increased with 398 helped last month.

With no further business, Gordon made the motion to adjourn.
