

## **Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting**

November 18, 2008

All the officers were present when the Penfield Township Trustees met for their regular meeting. Following the Pledge, the minutes of the November 4 meeting were read and approved.

Jean Eglin reported the flower beds have been taken care of and she has ordered cookies for the Christmas Band Concert.

Zoning Inspector Donahue has ordered new maps with the changes in zoning. The Jones Road junk or unlicensed vehicles violator is making progress on cleaning up his violations. The unmowed property on Whitehead Road did not pick up the certified letter. It is too late in the season to follow up on it but it will be attended to in the spring unless they comply. The property on Indian Hollow has not cleaned up, in fact they brought in more refuse. They have seven days to cleanup or it will be turned over to the prosecutor. The trailer on Rte. 18 has had the aluminum siding removed and there is the skeleton and trash left. The prosecutor will be consulted as to what further action should be taken.

The Fiscal Officer asked for, and was granted, to request donations of non perishable food items by those attending the Christmas Concert. It will be donated to Well Help.

Albrecht told that the spray at the cemetery us very effective. He has donated space to store the dump truck body for the time being.

Eglin has turned off the water at the parks. The trustees will attend to cleaning the toilet in the small park.

Gordon stated that the truck bed has been installed. They did not sand blast the frame as they were supposed to so the truck will be returned when they are ready to do the job. Cinders have been ordered and salt will be. The reflective house numbers can be obtained free by contacting any of the trustees. These aid in locating residences for the emergency vehicles.

Younglas reported he has had two funerals since the last meeting. The ply wood used in the cemetery is wearing out and will need replacing soon. He asked that buying a metal detector be considered for the cemetery. The markers are sunk in and dirty and difficult to find.

With no further business, Younglas made the motion to adjourn at 8:45, second by Gordon.
