

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees meeting held 11/7/06

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the minutes of the October 17 minutes were read and approved.

The contract with First Merit Bank to be the Township Depository was read and approved on a motion by Conrad, second by Younglas. Roll call, all yes.

The bills and blanket certificates were presented and approved on a motion by Conrad, second by Younglas. Roll call, all yes.

The contract for Hazardous material handling with Emergency Management was approved on a motion by Younglas, second by Conrad. Roll call, all yes.

An application for a Solid Waste grant in the amount of \$11,386.74 was reviewed and signed on a motion by Younglas, second by Conrad. Motion carried.

As part of the education for the recycling grant, items made of recycled material will be given away at the Christmas concert.

Younglas reported on the B2C2 meeting. The Board of Education will give a permanent loan to the Township of graduation photos, the old school bell and a few other items from the Penfield School which is closed.

Conrad stated that Crest fence is going to start on the fence repairs within the next two weeks. Dan Geib will be at the next meeting to go over the Cable contract provisions with the trustees.

Gordon said the garage addition will begin in 2 weeks and that the new doors have been installed on the garage. There were 50 gallons of used motor oil collected at the dumpster days. Three dumpsters were filled and 1/2 scrap metal dumpster. 67 residents used the service.

Zoning Inspector Donahue handed out his report and the results of his contact with the cable company.

Alan Leiby attended and handed out a letter and documentation. In the past he contested the need for a paid building permit on a building to house a horse. The Prosecutor agreed it is agricultural regardless of the lot size He presented a copy of the Ohio Revised Code confirming this. He questioned the recent ruling that 5 acres constitutes a farm for permit purposes. The Prosecutor will be consulted for an opinion.

Eglin has winterized the park.

There were 666 voters at the election today.

With no further business, Younglas made the motion to adjourn.
