

## **Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting**

December 1, 2009

All the officers were present for the regular meeting of the Penfield Township Trustees. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved with one correction. Bill Albrecht did not finish the mowing. 11 guests were present.

Zoning Inspector Richard Donahue said that a property on Rte 18 is in automobile violation again and will follow up on it. One of the trustee candidates has not picked up her signs. He has done so. A property on Rte. 18 has two homes on it. The old home was to be demolished and the new one lived in. The owner will be asked to attend the December 15 meeting.

Jean Eglin stated that Well Help provided food for 1060 people last month.

Linda Van Meter reported that the Board of Zoning Appeals granted the gunsmithing home business permit for Mark Gordon.

Richard Conrad made the motion the bills be paid as presented, second by Tom Younglas. Roll call, all yes.

Fiscal Officer Eleanor Gndt asked approval of transferring \$2,000.00 to the trustees salaries, \$2,500.00 to the Fiscal Officers salary, and \$1,575.00 to Zoning Expenses from contingencies. A line transfer was for were for \$2,000 to recycling salaries. Approval on a motion by Conrad, second by Younglas. Roll call, all yes. She asked for a revision of appropriations reducing the gas tax by \$10,000.00 and increasing the Solid Waste Grant by \$2,000.00. Motion by Lloyd Gordon to approve, second by Younglas. Motion carried. She was notified that the Local Government Fund will be cut by \$2,811.53 this year. Se has talked to the Solid Waste Director who said that the grant funds will be cut or eliminated

Gordon has greased and oiled the snow plow, fixed the lights and spare tire. He announced that a reception honoring Tom Younglas will be held on December 13 at the Township Hall. Tom is retiring after having served as trustee for 36 years. He informed that the state has cleaned the ditch on Rte 301 by Indian Hollow Road and installed the culvert on Jones Road at Rte 301. The evening of dumpster day someone brought mattresses, real estate signs and trash in and dumped them in the parking lot. He will price jackets bearing the township name for the officers . He said the man interested in dismantling the newly purchased home is no longer interested.

Conrad said that it will cost about \$750.00 to send a sample to the EPA to determine if it is safe for the Fire Department to burn the home on the newly purchased property. He has invited Dan Gieb of South Shore Cable to the meeting to give his annual report.

Dean Bremke is willing to serve another term as a Board of Zoning Appeals member and Sandra Thomas as an alternate on that board. Rolland Dennison will serve another

term on the Zoning Commission. Conrad made the motion, second by Gordon that Dennison and Bremke be appointed for five years and Thomas for one. Roll call, all yes.

With no further business, Gordon moved the meeting adjourn at 8:43 P.M.
