

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting

December 2, 2008

All the officers and 16 guests were in attendance for the regular meeting of the Penfield Township Trustees which convened at 8:03 P.M. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved

Deputy Curtis reported that Penfield is quiet but there has been car break ins in Huntington.

Zoning Inspector Donahue gave out his written report and said the Grudier complaint will be heard by Judge Betlaski. He met with the prosecutor regarding the trailer on Rte. 18 and a letter was written.

Linda Van Meter gave the year report on the Zoning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals and said the terms of Dennis Sudnick and Bruce Ramsey are up. Trustees will contact them. Alternate Tim Tyrone is also up.

The zoning violators from Indian Hollow Road were present to discuss the problem. They stated that some of the items being questioned were left by the previous owner. They said no more has been hauled in. When they were told they could not burn any more, they quit doing so. They pointed out the improvements to the home and felt that they are being singled out. They were told the rubble is right next to the road and an eyesore. All three trustees have visited them about the situation. Trustee Gordon stated "we are elected to enforce the township regulations and that is what we are trying to do."

The trustees said they will work together to reach an understanding and were assured the violation will be taken care of.

Albrecht stated the new truck bed is working out very well and would like to purchase a hose reel for the power washer.

Jean Eglin stated that Well Help gave away 187 food packages at Thanksgiving and thanked Younglas for his help. She gave dates for the next work and distribution days.

The Fiscal Officer was given permission to transfer \$500 from Workmans Comp to PERS on a motion by Conrad, second by Gordon. Motion carried. The appropriation revision was approved on a motion by Younglas, second by Gordon. Roll call, all yes. The invoices were approved to be paid on a motion by Conrad, second by Younglas. Roll call, all yes. The October financial report was approved on a motion by Gordon, second by Younglas, Motion carried.

A special meeting will be held on December 29 at 10 A.M. to attend to any business, pay bills and re-organize for 2009. The first meeting in January is cancelled.

The trustees discussed widening Webster Road and have contacted LaGrange Township to see if they will do their portion also. A joint Issue II grant would be applied for to do the work

Younglas gave a report on the B2C2 meeting.

Conrad contacted Dan Geib and got a machine regarding the Cable report and check. Geib didn't return the call. He took a load of recycables in to Ashland. Dave Kidder of Allied Waste will be contacted again to see what the fate of the recycling program will be to comply with the Solid Waste grant.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned on a motion by Younglas, second by Conrad at 8:45 P.M.
