

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees meeting held 4/2/07

The rescheduled meeting of the Penfield Township Trustees convened at 8:00 P.M. with trustee Younglas absent. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the minutes of the March 20 meeting were read and approved. There were 11 guests in attendance.

An Easter display had glass eggs stolen and flowers trampled. A house in the area was vandalized as well. The culprits were apprehended and attended the meeting. The eggs were returned. The trustees agreed that they should perform community service as their punishment for the township portion of the vandalism.

Zoning Inspector Donahue handed out the monthly report. Mrs. Donahue asked if she could write the 4H's asking them to clean up after themselves when they use the building. Permission was granted.

Duane Johnson, representing the Recreation Board, thanked the trustees for the donation to the silent auction and announced it, and the breakfast, were very successful. There were 160 served at the breakfast.

Al Leiby purchased letters on E Bay that were written during the Civil War to the Starr family who were early township settlers. He made up folders and presented them to the township.

Paul Eglin said that the truck has been repaired and is back in service.

Jean Eglin announced plans for pride day and the Well-Help Easter food distribution.

The trustees rode the roads with a representative from the engineers who gave suggestions on work to be performed. They also discussed drainage problems.

Conrad made the motion, second by Gordon the bills be paid as presented. Motion carried.

Crest fence worked on the fence but it is still unsatisfactory. They will be contacted to do the work over. When they installed the fence they blocked tile causing some of the flooding in the park.

ODOT was contacted regarding a road to Rte 301 when the parking lot is expanded. All that is needed is a driveway permit. They will be contacted about a sink hole north of Rte. 18.

Gordon reported that the new tractor has been delivered and progress on the garage addition.

Mr. Leiby objected to the "pay as you throw" that Allied Waste and the County Solid Waste are promoting. Discussion was held on the plan.

With no further business, Conrad made the motion, second by Gordon the meeting adjourn at 9 P.M.
