

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting

April 20, 2010

The minutes of the April 5 meeting were read with two corrections: the soap dispenser had to be installed in the hall kitchen, not the park and the burning of the house for mid-May, not June.

Zoning inspector Richard Donahue gave a verbal report. The Board of Zoning Appeals will hear a request for a wind turbine. He has issued a permit for a new home, the first this year.

Tim Tyrone of the Recreation Board presented a description of what the board would like to change on the sign at the park, which was approved by the trustees. Jackie Johnson, also of the park board asked if the small hall could not be rented when they Palm Sunday breakfast is held. The trustees agreed.

Jordan Ternes, of Spencer, attended the meeting as a Local Government class project. Bret Herbert, Jones Road was at the meeting as an interested new township resident.

A bill for the remainder of the wainscoting was presented and the check approved.

The program for Memorial Day was reviewed.

Richard Conrad stated that the tentative day for the burning of the building is May 23. At the State Winter Conference, the county officers were commended for having 65% attendance. Mrs. Sudnick, who with her husband owns the former store on Rte.18 and 301, inquired about getting a carry out liquor license. They were informed that the township was voted dry and the issue would have to go on the ballot. Conrad said the trustees rode the roads with the County Engineers and determined that Jones Road, from West Road east to Rte. 301 be resurfaced. The cost estimate is \$46,000.00 The OPW grant of widening Webster Road from Rte. 301 to Whitehead is estimated to be \$72,943.36.

Duane Johnson said that Worcester Woodworking will erect a chair rail at the trash receptacles to prevent them from marring the walls. He has spoken to the Wellington sexton asking about continuing cemetery headstone footers. He also was contacted by LaGrange about replacing portions of fence at the Jackson Cemetery the cost of which is shared by LaGrange, Wellington, Pittsfield and Penfield. The old high schools pictures from the Penfield School have been laying in one of the offices. He has priced a photo track to hang them in the office hall. The cost of \$230.00 was approved on a motion by Johnson, second by Conrad. Roll call, all yes. He stated the photos from 1909-17 and 1920-'25 are missing.

Bill Brown of the Wellington Fire District was present to speak on the renewal levy the department is putting on the ballot. The meeting adjourned on a motion by Conrad at 8:47 P.M.
