

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees meeting held 5/1/07

All the officers and 8 guests were present for the regular meeting of the Penfield Township Trustees which convened at 8 P.M. The minutes of the April 17 meeting were read and approved after the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

State Highway Patrolman Jordan Cottom spoke of traffic problems south of Rte. 303 and stated that a patrolman will be on duty focusing on the eight townships in that area. He gave statistics on the accidents in the county as well as locally. He asked anyone that knows of speeders or other traffic problems to contact the Elyria State Highway Post.

Zoning Inspector Donahue reported that the violator on Rte. 18 is cleaning up around her home. The one on Foster Road has not done anything. The dumpster will be at the hall on May 19 and if the clean up is not done then, the matter will be pursued further. He handed out the monthly report.

Discussion was held on the progress of the garage addition.

Jean Eglin said the vandals worked around the hall for their community service and will work again on Pride Day. The Earth Day activities were enjoyable and the Alumni Band and Friends will perform their Christmas program the first weekend of December.

Bill Albrecht stated the weed control at the cemetery was successful and some areas need a treatment. Ideas were brought forth on how to spruce up the cemetery. Suggestions will be sought on how to make the cemetery more attractive.

Duane Johnson said that the problems with scheduling the tournaments on the Penfield field have been worked out and scheduling has been done for them for 2008. The Recreation Board has installed benches at the walking trail and is working at the park.

After discussion, it was decided to order a 4 cu. yard dumpster instead of the weekly pick up. One with a locking top would be desirable. Approval was given to have a tire dumpster furnished by Lorain County Solid Waste brought to Penfield on May 19.

Drainage and the turn around on Sooy Road were discussed and the Engineers will be consulted as to alternate drainage.

Conrad will be taking in a load of recyclables. He picked up carpet and trash along Sooy Road.

Younglas attended the B2C2 meeting and gave a report.

Younglas made the motion, second by Conrad the bills be paid as presented. Motion carried.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:40 P.M. on a motion by Conrad, second by Younglas.
