

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees meeting held 7/18/06

All three trustees were present for the regular meeting which convened at 8:02 P.M. The minutes of the July 3 meeting were approved as presented.

Zoning Inspector Donahue handed out a copy of a letter he wrote to South Shore cable regarding service areas. A resident has car parts and unlicensed or expired plate vehicles on his premises that he has promised to clean up but has not done so. The Prosecutor will be contacted to follow up on the matter. Donahue suggested a sign be put under the Community Hall sign with the web address. He will obtain prices. There is a possible leak in the water pipe since one area stays wet. It will be checked out.

Mr. and Mrs Duane Johnson represented the Recreation Board. New padlocks have been put on the pavilion and all the trees pruned in the park by the Rec. Board.

LaGrange Township has agreed to pave the area from their line to Rte 301 when they do their own portion. The cost will be \$5,800. Approval was given on a motion by Gordon, second by Conrad. Motion carried.

A quote was received from Lytle Construction for resurfacing Jones Rd., from Foster, east to the County line for \$6,239.00 and Short Rd. from Vermont east to the County line \$3,257.00 Motion to approve the contract was made by Conrad, second by Younglas, All in favor.

The ditch work on Webster Road will be a cost share project with LaGrange Township. Younglas made the motion. second by Gordon it be approved, not to exceed Penfield's share of \$4,000.00. Roll call, all yes.

Younglas is spraying the cattails along Short Road. Trustees Conrad and Gordon were thanked for using their own trucks to haul 21 lorads of road grindings to the park.

John Honoshofsky will remove 39 trees and grind them in the cemetery for \$2,450.00 Younglas made the motion, second by Conrad he be awarded the work. Roll call, all yes.

Plans for the garage addition will be drawn up and the Amish contacted as to a price for time and material.

With no further business, Conrad made the motion to adjourn.
