

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting

July 20, 2010

All the officers and four guests were present for the regular meeting. Following the Pledge, the minutes of the last meeting were approved with one correction. The cemetery regulations that were deleted should not have been.

Zoning Inspector Richard Donahue stated that he has sent two letters regarding the need to cut grass. If they don't comply it will be mowed for them and put on the taxes.

Discussion was held on ways to cut back the cost of the recycling program. It was suggested that only one man work on Wednesdays instead of two. Donahue offered to give up his time on Wednesday except to help when there is baling to be done.

Checks 8508-8509 & 8510 were approved for payment on a motion by Richard Conrad, second by Duane Johnson. All yes.

The OPW grant application for Phase II of Webster Road widening was approved on a motion by Conrad, second by Johnson. Roll call, all yes.

Johnson moved to remain with the Frank Gates Company for Workman's Compensation. Second by Conrad. Roll call all yes.

The June financial report was approved on a motion by Lloyd Gordon, second by Johnson. Motion carried.

Conrad reported on the county meeting where the subject of forming police districts was discussed. The southern townships would not have the funding to support such a district. He will have a load of recyclables to take in.

The defibrillators have arrived. A total of five members of the Recreation Board and trustees took a class on the operation of them. A lock box and location of them was discussed with no action taken.

Gordon said that the fence in the park has been started. There is a hold up across the front because two Gas companies are involved. He will meet with a representative of the one with restrictions to determine what can be done. He will meet with Chris French and a representative from Modern Poured Walls in the cemetery on the proposed Eagle Scout project French intends doing. He reported a Rural Water leak at Jones and Rte. 301. Lytle has spread stone on Jones Road where it is oily due to the extreme high temperatures. The new Superintendent of schools asked to attend a meeting and a date will be determined.
