

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting

August 4, 2009

All the officers and ten guests were present for the regular Penfield Township Trustees meeting which convened at 8 P.M. No minutes were read,

Fire Chief Bob Walker attended. He stated the Fireman Brian Slack will be commended by the Red Cross for his first aid skills while waiting for the paramedics to arrive at a recent emergency. A chili cook off will be held at the Fairgrounds on October 17 with all proceeds going to Well-Help. The Department has submitted an application for the Federal Stimulus Grant money being offered but no word has been received as to the status. He is going to check into cost of lock boxes for residents.

Zoning Inspector Richard Donahue had presented a Zoning Regulations policy for the trustees to review at an earlier meeting. Richard Conrad made the motion, second by Lloyd Gordon that it be approved. Roll call, all yes. Donahue handed out the monthly report. A complaint was received about demo derby cars at a Vermont Street residence. They will be used at the fair in two weeks but the property owner agreed to house one. Progress is being made on the Jones Road violations.

Jean Eglin gave the Well Help report. In June 142 families were served, 434 people. In July 151 families were taken care of comprised of 503 people. She asked anyone having surplus garden vegetables bring them to her or directly to Well Help.

David Thomas asked trustees for help in solving a noise problem he is experiencing. The renter neighbors have frequent parties and get together. The boom box is at the highest volume making his house actually vibrate. The people must shout to be heard in addition. Trash is being thrown into his yard He called the sheriff twice, at 9 and 11:30 P.M. and the response came at 1 A.M. When he tried to talk to the neighbors they came right to his property line and became aggressive. Speaking to the owner brought no response. Trustee Gordon will talk to the property owner.

The Zoning Commission has approved several amendments and submitted them to the trustees. The Public Hearing has been set for September 1 at 7:30 P.M. on the matters.

Approval was given for the Fiscal Officer to advance \$5,000.00 to the Gas Tax Fund from the General Fund on a motion by Tom Younglas, second by Conrad. Motion carried. She was given approval to amend the other zoning expenses with a \$1,500 increase on a motion by Conrad, second by Gordon. Roll call, all yes.

The bills were approved as presented for payment and the purchase orders approved on a motion by Gordon, second by Younglas. Motion carried.

Gordon reported that Gledhill is ready to work on the dump truck however it is being used. He took the currently owned bucket for the loader to Jack Schartman for the needed change instead of purchasing a new one. The can crusher isn't working in the

recycling building and Gndt Electric will be contacted for repair. He and Conrad repaired the soffit on the hall that came loose.

Conrad stated that the Jones Road ditching needs to be extended. After discussion, Gordon made the motion, second by Younglas the additional work be done. Roll call, all yes.

With no further business, Younglas made the motion, second by Conrad the meeting adjourn at 9:02 P.M.
