

## **Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees meeting held 8/15/06**

August 15. All the officers were present for the regular meeting which convened at 8:10 P.M. Following the pledge, the minutes of the August 1 meeting were read and approved. Mrs. Wise, who is running for State Senate, spoke on her candidacy.

Zoning Inspector Donahue has issued a permit for a new home to Mr. and Mrs. Charles Price. They will build a new home behind an existing one. A security deposit was obtained to guarantee demolition of the old one when the new one is habitable. Donahue reported the clean up of the Lukas property is complete. Trustee Gordon and Donahue will meet with the cable company to determine if the township is getting credit for the south side of Webster Road.

Younglas made the motion to purchase 5 washable furnace filters @ \$128 each, second by Gordon. Roll call all yes.

A thank you will be sent to Gary Weigl for trimming the bushes at the hall.

Jackie and Duane Johnson of the Recreation Board were in attendance. They have ordered a new swing to replace the broken one and will repaint the playground equipment where needed. Each Tuesday is a work night. They reported that vehicle windows have been smashed and purses stolen from inside them.

Younglas made the motion to pay the bills as presented and approve purchase orders and blanket certificates. Second by Gordon. Roll call, all yes.

Fence posts in the small park are heaving out of the ground. Crest fence installed them. They, and Elyria Fence, have been contacted to get quotes on remedying the situation.

The recycled material squares under the swing set are separating. The Fiscal Officer will write Turtle Plastics and send a copy to Solid Waste. The tile was never properly installed and has been a source of problems.

Conrad, Gordon and Gmandt attended the Commissioners meeting where the possible cut in Sheriff's patrols was a topic of discussion. Conrad reported on it.
