

Minutes of Penfield Township Board of Trustees Meeting

August 5, 2008

All the officers and 17 guests were present for the regular meeting. Following the Pledge, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Deputy Curtis handed out his report. He stated that there have been problems with gas being siphoned out of tanks in other areas. He asked that anyone seeing anything suspicious call the sheriff.

Prosecutor Matt Michak attended to discuss the Grudier violations. Seven of the ten vehicles on the place have current license plates registered to other vehicles. Nothing can be done about this unless they are operated on the highway. Under the new law, three letters have to be sent to the violator. The last gives a hearing date with trustees. There are three criteria that have to be met. At least one vehicle meets all three. Others are apparently inoperable with grass growing up on them, hood latches that don't close, tires are flat, etc. However for the present, only one vehicle will be targeted unless there is no cooperation with the rest. He also addressed the procedure needed to have lawns mowed. Zoning Inspector Donahue showed photos of yards that appear to have had no mowing done this year. The matter will be pursued. Donahue handed out his monthly report and asked to send two people notices who have temporary housing permits that are soon to expire or have expired. Trustees agreed.

Two scouts were present to see what the meetings are like. The one would like a project he can do. Trustees will meet with him on it.

A recent storm felled a tree in the small park and trustees will cut it up and remove it . The tree ruined a section of fence and Crest fence will be contacted to replace it. Mark Brown, who lives next to the park suggested they look at the others also to see if they need cutting down.

The Fiscal Officer was given permission to transfer \$1,750 from the General Fund to the Cemetery Fund and a line transfer in the Gas tax fund from Workman's Compensation to PERS. Motion by Gordon, second by Conrad, Motion carried.

Payment of bills as presented was approved on a motion by Gordon, second by Younglas. Roll call, all yes.

Younglas reported that he has had one burial since the last meeting and sold five lots.

The meeting adjourned at 9:06 P.M. on a motion by Younglas.
